



March Demonstrations: Presented by Jerry McCracken, Jon Rouleau and Jim Echter


Jerry McCracken led off as the first of three presenters at our March meeting. Jerry demonstrated two different pieces of jewelry: a pair of bird house earrings and an offset turned brooch. For the earrings, Jerry said it was important to choose a relatively hard wood that would not tear out. The stock need not be large, and Jerry uses ¾ inch square pieces. The brooch started out as a 3 inch disk of wood (it looked about ½ inch thick) attached to a chucked block of wood with double stick tape. The chuck had two jaws removed, which allows the piece to be shifted for the offset turning. Jerry finishes his pieces by buffing.

Next up was Jon

Rouleau, who demonstrated a tool that he's found useful for roughing out bowls: the Easy Rougher. The tool, designed by Craig Jackson of Easy Wood Tools, is square shanked with a replaceable tip. Jon had a number of DVDs showing the many uses for the tool, including, despite its name, finish cuts, and he made the DVDs available to members during the "Show and Share" period. He hopes to have more for our April meeting.

The third presenter in our evening trio was Jim Echter, who showed us how to make rings. The rings begin as glue ups of 3-5 pieces of thin wood, with each piece's grain rotated 90 degrees. Next, a ¼ inch hole is

drilled to accommodate a ¼ inch bolt which is held in a collet chuck. After turning the outside, the ring is re-chucked in a 4 jaw chuck with #1 jaws to permit hollowing out the



center. After sanding Jim uses CA glue as a finish, but he warned that as the CA is rubbed on it will get hot and smoke. DO NOT breath the smoke. Final shaping is accomplished on a mandrel.


