

### **May Demonstration**

Jeffery Cheramie closed out the 2008-2009 FLWT season in May with a presentation on the bowl gouge and turning a banana bowl. Jeffery suggested that a 5/8 inch gouge was about right, as a ½ inch gouge would vibrate too much with a large overhang. He sharpens his bowl gouges with the "Ellsworth grind" at

about a 60-65 degree angle. Another gouge, with an 85 degree angle is good for closed form bowls.

The banana bowl starts with a rectangular blank, rather than a square one.

Jeffery said that it is



important to feed slowly, as there is a great deal of "wood-air, wood-air" cutting in turning the bowl. He brought up the tailstock to support the turning, as it was off balance at the beginning of the process. His rpm on the lathe was slow, in the 500-700 rpm range,

depending on the initial size of the blank. As the bowl neared completion, Jeffery stressed to keep mass in the center while turning, and to finish the "wings" before the center. The finished bowl does, indeed, resemble a banana.
