At the Friday meeting, Beth will talk about many of the facets that make up her career as a professional including her ventures into "Turn Around America", her past and present work, and how she's doing it. On Saturday, Beth will be combining two demos, Turning With Your Mind and Turning Outside the Box. Turning With Your Mind includes creative problem solving so everyone can use a chart to come up with an original idea. Beth Ireland Coming in April

Our April meeting is shaping up to be a very exciting and informative weekend. Nationally known woodturner/woodworker Beth Ireland will be coming to the Finger Lakes Woodturning Club on April 17 - 19. Put it on your calendar and don't forget that the April general meeting will be on Friday, April 17 (not Thursday).

On Friday Beth will present a discussion on many of the topics that involve her world of woodworking and turning. She will talk about many of the facets that make up her career as a professional including her ventures into "Turn Around America", her past and present work, and how she's doing it.

Saturday promises to be a very informative day. Beth will combine two demos, Turning With Your Mind and Turning Outside the Box. Turning With Your Mind includes creative problem solving so everyone can use a chart to come up with an original idea. Turning Outside the Box includes how to marry the bandsaw with the lathe to create boxes and patterned platters that can be turned on the lathe.

Sunday will be a hands on workshop and we have options. Beth has said she could do one of three classes. Graphic Turning, making graphs on three dimensional turnings and laying out patterns for bowls and vessels. It will involve spindle turning a barley twist and then laying out patterns on bowls or vessels that you pre-make and bring to the workshop. The second option is Tool Making which involves learning how to make and sharpen your own tools. The third option is to combine the above two workshops. Mark will be sending an email survey out to you to help determine which of the three options serves the interests of the membership best. It will include more details on each option including what you will need to bring and if there will be additional costs for materials. Be on the lookout for it and please respond to it promptly.

As usual, the Saturday demo will cost \$35 and the Sunday workshop will cost \$65. You can pay via PayPal on the website or by check that you would give or send to our treasurer, Dave Ververs.

Lamp Turning Demo - Sam Tischler By Brice Impey



Sam Tischler gave a very interesting media presentation on light bulbs and a demo on lamp turning at our March meeting. The media presentation used a "prezzy" format on the internet. There should by now be a link to it on our website. It is not turning technology, but the brief history of the light bulb was interesting and relevant. Sam brought three examples of what he has explored with lamps; desk lamp, Edison bulb lamp and beer glass lamp. He mentioned hanging lamp shades and mentioned Andre Martel. Here is a very interesting hanging lampshade by Martel http://www.martel.public.netc.net/.


Sam did not do a turning demo on the desk lamp, but he showed it and discussed what he might do differently with the base and also the cracking of the shade from the lamp heat. I heard Jim Etcher suggest using an LED rather than a standard light bulb and thought that was a pretty good solution.

The first of two demonstrated projects was the beer glass lamp. It is a sort of free standing sconce, if that is not too contradictory. A base for the light bulb and a glass cylinder and then a lid. Sam used glued up blanks of alternating Maple and Walnut. He made the base and the top from one 4x4 blank. He made a recess for the socket about 1 7/16 in deep and then drilled through with a 1" Forstner bit. You might have to do some tool work to make the hardware fit exactly. Sam was using a rubber socket for the light bulb.

Next cut a groove on the face of the base for the glass with a parting tool. You would drill a 1/4 "hole for the lamp wire before parting off the base. Sam likes to use self-adhesive nubs on the bottom of the base as feet. The base is about 2" thick and the top ½". Make sure you make the channel for the glass cylinder to allow for heat expansion. The glass cylinder was a beer bottle cut with a Kinkajou glass cutter, about \$50. Sam was using a 3/8 bowl gouge as the wood in in the bowl orientation. Add a bead to the top and part off. Sam would finish the top in a cole jaw jig.

Next Sam turned the base for the Edison Lamp. This is candlestick type base for a raw clear lightbulb. A Maple/Walnut glueup was also used for this. Sam uses a "keyless" fixture and drilled 3" deep with a Forstner bit and recessed the bottom (toward the tail-stock).

There are plenty of directions to go for a challenge project after this demonstration.









